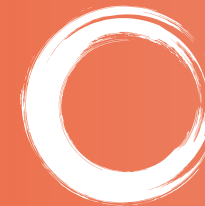

The Human Rights Education Institute offers proactive education programs that teach human rights, acceptance, respect for diversity, and cultural humility. Our programs, activities, and events seek to reduce racial prejudice and increase understanding in our community.

We are on a journey to promote human rights for every person in the Pacific Northwest, serving Primarily Eastern Washington, Northern Idaho and Western Montana. The institute addresses a wide range of diversity issues including race, ethnicity, gender, socioeconomic class, age, sexual orientation, religion, disability, and job and life circumstances.

The Kootenai County Task Force on Human Relations and the Greg C. Carr Foundation, among other community leaders and groups, established the Human Rights Education Institute in 1998 based on lessons learned during the community's long struggle with the white supremacists and Aryan Nations groups that settled in the area.
